Travel & Possession Not Permitted Under Any Circumstance



## Summary

- No medical marijuana program exists.
- Recreational cannabis: Fully prohibited under the Law on Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (Law No. 673 of 1998) and the Lebanese Penal Code.

## Background

No formal medical marijuana program exists in Lebanon. In April 2020, the Lebanese Parliament legalized the cultivation of cannabis for strictly industrial and medical purposes, but this measure applies only to licensed producers and is aimed at export, not domestic consumption.

## Non-Medical Cannabis

The Law on Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (Law No. 673 of 1998) criminalizes the production, possession, sale, and use of cannabis for recreational purposes.

## Traveling to Lebanon with Medical Cannabis

Travelers cannot bring cannabis-based medications, CBD oils, edibles, or hemp products.

### Steps to Take Before Departure:

1. Do not carry marijuana, CBD products, or high-THC medications into Lebanon.
2. Check the ingredients of your medications to ensure they contain no prohibited cannabinoids.
3. If you require cannabis-based treatment, speak to your doctor about alternative medications permitted in Lebanon.

- Leave all cannabis products at home, including non-psychoactive CBD.
- Cannabis-based medicines (including oils, edibles, capsules) are banned unless part of a licensed hemp medical project.
